The PE finding is money each school has been given to spend on staff training and CPD; providing supply teachers to cover PE staff for training purposes, increasing the competitive sports opportunities within school; and observing and monitoring PE and its assessment across the school.

The government believes that the PE finding should be used to: promote healthy lifestyles including participation in sport and addressing obesity; improve quality of PE and sport for all children increase competitive sporting opportunities for all children.

At Monkseaton Middle School, we provide the required 2 hours of high quality Physical Education per week to all pupils in KS2 as well as a wide range of extra-curricular activities offering students the opportunity to be involved in a wide variety of sport, both at the recreational and competitive level.

Gymnastics Coaching	£300	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KS2 students have had access to a highly-trained Gymnastics coach to further their skills and interests • Ongoing CPD for PE teacher in Gymnastics – this has impacted upon all teaching of Gymnastics across the school
Deliver sport before school, and after school clubs	£30	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased participation in non-curriculum sports • Increased engagement in PE lesson
Deliver lunchtime sports clubs to targeted cohorts	£30	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased levels of fitness in students who do not traditionally engage with PE outside of lessons

This led to increased engagement by students who are physically challenged and unable to participate fully in PE as a result
Funding for transport costs for sports teams to attend competitive events	£280	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KS2 students engage in competitive sporting opportunities
Repair, replace and carry out remedial work on PE equipment and its storage to ensure safety for use	£1000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All students have the opportunity to access high quality equipment not normally provided to Primary age children, such as rowing machines and Rugby tackle equipment. This has increased engagement and levels of participation.
Alternative Sports Day at Leisure Centre (plus transport costs)	£680 (£180)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All Y5 students taken to participate in sports that are not generally accessible in school, including trampolining, crown green bowling, Archery and Multi-Sports activities. This increased engagement and enthusiasm for sports. •
Support to enable most Y6 students to attend Residential Outward Bound Centre (High Borrans)	£1500	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Significant proportion of Y6 students attendance at residential Outward Bound Centre supported – access to a wide range of outdoor and adventurous activities, increasing confidence, engagement and participation in sporting activities. • Supply over for staff to support this event
Judo Sessions	£986	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KS2 students offered opportunity to participate in extra-curricular Judo sessions – increasing engagement and competitive skills

KS2 Tennis Club	£300	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Access to local tennis club for two 6-week programmes of after-school Tennis sessions for high quality coaching will provide increased engagement, improve skills and increased access to competitive sports • CPD for PE teacher through team teaching at the sessions
Access to Coaching programme, coaching sessions for Handball, Dodgeball, Fencing, Cricket, Tennis, Tri-Golf, Futsal, Badminton, Basketball, Hockey, Tag Rugby, Rock-it-Ball, Volleyball, Ultimate Frisbee	£600	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 120 students from KS2 have access to a very wide range of sporting opportunities increasing participation, engagement, and fitness
Cycling Generations – coaches, bike hire and safety equipment and transport to other venues	£1000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students have training on the safe use of bikes in addition to increased exposure to the competitive elements of cycling and increased engagement and awareness of outdoor adventurous activities.
CPD for PE teacher on OAA	£500	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improved skills for teachers leading to greater engagement by students.

The sustainability of the impact of the Primary PE funding will be maintained by adaptations to the curriculum to include 'alternative' sports experienced through the additional programmes, in addition to monitoring the continued involvement of students in extra-curricular activities.
